

Medications to avoid prior to your surgery

INSTRUCTIONS and INFORMATION for PATIENTS and CAREGIVERS



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MEDICATIONS TO AVOID PRIOR TO YOUR SURGERY

Non-steroidal anti-inflammatory drugs (NSAIDS)

These are non-narcotic medications used for arthritis and pain relief. These medications need to be stopped for at least 10 full days prior to surgery. NSAIDS are available in both prescription and non-prescription strengths. NSAIDS may also be used alone or combined with other medications in several common cold, flu and sinus products.

If you must take something for headache, menstrual cramps or other aches and pains, you may take TYLENOL (Acetaminophen) as directed prior to your surgery. Check the labels on any medicine you plan to take in pill, capsule or liquid form. Do not take anything containing acetylsalicylic acid or salicylates.

REMEMBER: TYLENOL ONLY FOR PAIN

Some herbal preparations can also cause bleeding, so we recommend stopping natural herbal supplements as well.

ANTICOAGULANT MEDICATIONS

Stopping the following medications should be discussed with your cardiologist or surgeon:

- Enoxaparin (Lovenox)
- Heparin
- Coumadin (Warfarin)
- Melagatran (Ximelagaram)
- Ticlid (Ticlopidine)
- Plavix (Clopridogrel)
- Pletal (Pentoxifyline)
